The first IAIE conference was held in Utrecht (Netherlands) in 1982. Since then, more than **30 conferences** have taken place (see [HERE](#) for a full list).

These conferences are crucial for our association, as they provide a space where the IAIE community combines theory and practice, establishes professional collaborations and personal friendships, and fosters motivation to contribute to a world where people truly “**learn to live together**”.

More precisely, we will critically examine **current trends and approaches in intercultural education**, strengthening those that promote social justice, democracy, equity, and a sense of belonging for all. 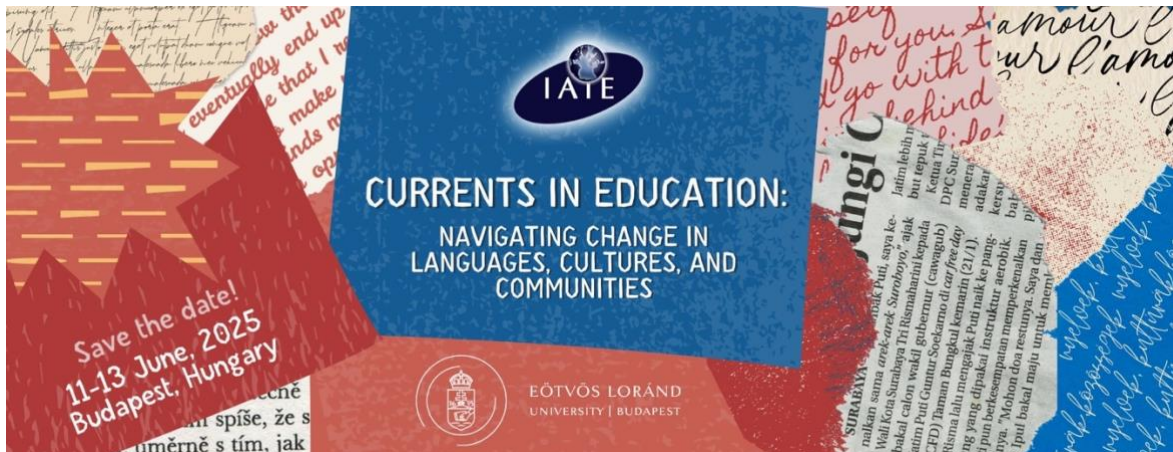

School visit

The deadline for submitting proposals is 5 April 2024 (however, the registration system on our website will remain open until 10 April). More detailed information about the conference can be found on [the website](#).

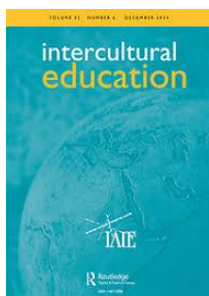

Call for Papers for the Special Section of the Comparative Education Review Journal (CER): Internationalisation and transnationalisation of ‘Roma education’

Guest Editors: Dr. Christian Brüggeman (Hochschule für Soziale Arbeit und Pädagogik, Berlin) & Dr. Simona Szakács-Behling (Helmut-Schmidt-University, Hamburg)

Background: Research on Roma (and) education has increased significantly in recent decades. International household surveys have repeatedly documented striking educational disparities between Roma and non-Roma populations, as well as significant differences between countries. Defining Roma as the explicit target group for policy action carries the risk of downplaying their extreme diversity and might come along with high costs such as stigmatization and local resistance while approaches that target marginalized communities in general may exclude Roma as beneficiaries.

Contributions Sought: This special section welcomes papers that critically and comparatively look at international and transnational aspects of Roma education including questions of knowledge production, educational transfer and borrowing/lending across various borders, both empirical and scientific, and across actor groups.

Submission Procedure: Expressions of interest should be sent to CER_SpecialSection@luc.edu by April 1st, 2025 in the form of an outline of approximately 1,000 - 1,200 words. For more details, please feel free to visit the [instructions for authors page](#) on the CER website.

Timeline

April 1, 2025 Deadline to submit abstracts.

May 1, 2025 Authors of accepted and rejected abstracts to be notified of the editors' decision

October 15, 2025 Authors expected to submit their full articles for review, no later than October 2025.

March 15, 2026 Submitted papers undergo blind peer review and will be selected on the basis of academic merit. Resubmissions are due by March 2026.

Winter 2026 Special Section of the Comparative Education Review to be published (end of 2026).



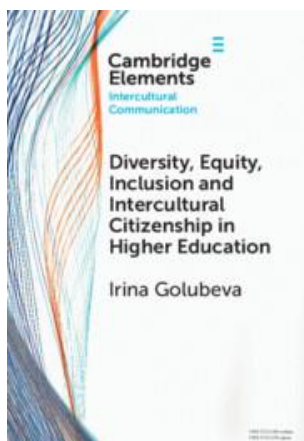
A new issue of Daedalus by “The global quest for educational equity” edited by James A. Banks

New eTwinning group on Individual Pupil Mobility

[The Europe on the Move Council recommendation](#) adopted by the Ministers of Education in May 2024, calls for:

- **fostering cooperation** between regional and local authorities, **education and training providers**, the youth and sports sector, **civil society organizations** and **private bodies**

to promote and support outgoing learning mobility, and creating a welcoming environment for incoming learning participants from abroad

- providing systemic learning mobility opportunities as an integral part of school education embedding incoming and outgoing mobility
- promoting youth information on learning mobility
- making progress towards automatic recognition of learning periods abroad within Long-term Individual Pupil Mobility programmes.

We are glad we can now offer support to educators in tackling these aspects, designing a school internationalisation strategy that embraces all types of learning mobilities, including Individual Pupil Mobility offered by public and private providers.
